

There has been a lot of confusion about the symptoms parents need to be aware of. The public health authorities ask parents not to send their child to school if they are experiencing any of the following symptoms:



- Fever (38°+)
- New cough
- Shortness of breath
- Loss/change of smell/taste
- Fatigue
- Aches/pains
- Sore throat
- Headache
- Feeling sick
- Diarrhoea

Or with any of the above symptoms and a runny/stuffy nose.

We are lucky to have a very able Board of Management with expertise in many fields. The board meets at least every term and more often for appointments of teachers or other urgent business.

Our most recent meeting of the Board of management was held on 29/09/2021

Here are the agreed minutes:

- Correspondence received from Mrs Barrett thanking Eyrecourt NS for her send off in June. Mrs Barrett has sponsored YARC (York Assessment of Reading for Comprehension) for the school as a token of her appreciation.
- Teaching staff were trained in CPR, defibrillator use and choking by Eyrecourt CFR trainers Declan Dunican and Padraic Loughnane. It was decided that the school should have a defibrillator in the building and funding from Eyrecourt NS Parents Association would be requested.
- The post of Deputy Principal and Assistant Principal 2 post to be advertised and appointed following Department of Education guidelines in November 2021
- If a positive Covid case was to arise in the school, the principal will send a text to all parents stating that there is a case in the school and ask parents to monitor their child for any symptoms.
